

ANKO TORRONTÉS

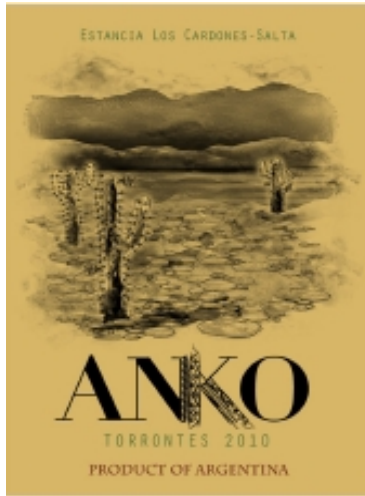
Description: We strive to achieve a *terroir*-driven Torrontés from Cafayate, Salta - a savory wine with minerals, white flowers, and citrus.

Label Notes: Anko means "high water" in the native Indian language of Salta, located in the northwest corner of Argentina. The vineyards are indeed an oasis amid the surrounding jagged, high desert landscape.
