ARGENTINE CABERNET SAUVIGNON TERROIRS & STYLES

Cabernet Sauvignon Son of Cabernet Franc and Sauvignon Blanc, he is the king of red grapes and arrived in Argentina in 1853, at the same time as Malbec. For many years he was the main component of the Bordeaux blend style for high-end wines in Argentina. During the 1990's, when Argentina decided to compete in the international market, Cabernet Sauvignon was the first choice, but fell into the shadows of Malbec.



Tolombom, Valle Calcahqui, Salta 5,741 ft Asl. This terroir, one of the highest in the world, has a great desertic mountain micro-climate, with very rocky soil. Patches of mica gives these wines a unique, savory character, with nice color, great structure, and very round tannins.

Agrelo, Lujan de Cuyo. 2,950ft-3350ft. Asl. This is one of the most traditional areas for quality wine in Mendoza. Deep soil of clay and sand, but with an extremally rocky soil at 3.5ft and deeper, you find Cabernet Sauvignons with great mid-palate and structure. The tannins are ripe and round thanks to long, warm days and cool nights which leads to wine of balanced, yet pronounced fruit.

San Pablo, Tunuyan, Valle de Uco. 4,450 ft Asl. This new IG has outstanding characteristics. The terrior has heterogeneous alluvial soils, with patches of calcareous deposits which gives the wines a vibrant midpalate with dark fruit and some violet aromas. This terroir is where Jean Claude Berrouet (former winemaker of Petrus) chose to make his Cabernet Sauvignon and Merlot, due to these attributes.

La Consulta, San Carlos, Valle de Uco. 3,500ft Asl While this very cold IG is famous for its great and full of color Malbec, it has recently been discovered that La Consulta can produce excellent Cabernet Sauvignon. These wines keep hints of mint, but also very good berry fruits and has nice structure in the mouth. It is a perfect balance between new and old world.

San Javier, Rio Negro, Patagonia coastal. 30 ft Asl. This the only Patagonia terroir with maritime influence. This terrior is unique for Argentina, since most of the other terroirs have continental weather. The Cabernet Sauvignon is found in sandy and clay soil with ocean influence with a delicate, more floral character, some mint, eucalyptus and a delicate body with a nice, long finish.
