



ABOUT US

At Vino Del Sol, our Company's Mission is to be Your Trusted Source for Great Wine; however, in order to accomplish this goal, we MUST also be Your Trusted Source for Sustainable Wine.

According to Vino del Sol's Founder and President, Matt Hedges, "Sustainability is the bedrock upon which we founded our company in 2004. We chose to work only with wineries that follow **Sustainable Practices**, are **Estate-Grown**, and **Family-Owned**; they are the 3 Pillars that form our foundation in Sustainability."

ESTATE-GROWN

Wine begins in the vineyards, and we believe it is important for wineries to own and farm their own vines. This promotes the highest level of quality control in the vineyards. Farming the same vines in the same terroir year after year, gives a continuity to the wines' style. Estate vineyards also protect our customers from grape price fluctuations.



SUSTAINABLY-FARMED

All wineries in the Vino del Sol portfolio are sustainably farmed. Our wines are created in an environmentally-conscious and socially-friendly way, and the vineyards can continue to produce grapes indefinitely. The wineries proudly invest in the long-term employment and care of their workers like Tassajara with over 20 employees with 20+ years of employment. Zolo and Tapiz achieved the Global G.A.P. (Good Agricultural Practice) certification and were awarded the Gold Medal for Sustainable Practices at the 2011 Great Wine Capitals Awards. Gen5 and Criss Cross are certified green by Lodi Rules and use solar panels and renewable energy. Our wineries go the extra mile to protect the soil in a sustainable manner: ZaHa creates their compost out of the discarded grape skins and wine solids. Altocedro uses low intervention methods along with natural yeasts and is a gravity fed winery. Lamadrid uses high density plantings to naturally balance the cluster-per-vine production. Tapiz owns two certified organic vineyards and was awarded 2017 Gold Medal on sustainability from the Botanical Research Institute of Texas. The wineries utilize computer-controlled drip irrigation to further conserve water. Wapisa is a proud Partner in Conservation of the California Ocean Alliance. Tassajara (Scheid) won the 2019 California Green Medal Environment Award. Taonga is certified sustainable by Sustainable Winegrowing New Zealand. And Obata Shuzo is the winner of the 2020 Sataoyama Award for Sustainability in Japan.

All of our Argentine wines are vegan.

FAMILY-OWNED

The wine business is a long-term one. Decisions made in the vineyard today may not be reflected in the bottle for several years. Corporate management, usually focused on short-term earnings, is often not conducive to building sustainable wine brands. All Vino del Sol wineries are family-owned and operated, with a shared multi-generational vision for building and maintaining sustainable long-term business.

For example, **Gen5** is a joint-venture between **Vino del Sol** and the **LangeTwins winery**. The **Lange** family has been farming the same land in Lodi for five generations. The **Obata** family behind our Sakes is fifth generation. Our newest wine, **Osmosis**, is made by the **Ortiz Family**, also owners of **Tapiz**, **Zolo**, and **Wapisa**. **Vino del Sol** is proud to have worked with several of these winery families for over fifteen years.



COMMUNITY OUTREACH

Sustainability, also means community social responsibility. Llamas graze on the vineyards of Tapiz, Zolo and Osmosis, and provide wool for local weavers as well as support local schools; ZaHa & TeHo fund local schools; Tassajara provides energy for local homes; Altocedro employs local workers and has an annual charity auction to benefit the area; Obata Shuzo employs and uses resources from the island. These are just some examples of our wineries giving back to the community.

Sustainability, means focusing on the long-term: in our relationships, our customers, wineries & vineyards, and our employees. Vino del Sol is proud to be working with many of the same wineries, customers, and employees since our founding in 2004. Altocedro was founded in 1999 by visionary Karim Mussi, a third-generation Lebanese immigrant. Karim and his family pioneered La Consulta in the Uco Valley as a special place to make "born and raised" wines. In 2014, fifteen years later, Karim's crazy idea of high-altitude farming became conventional wisdom and now La Consulta is classified as one of Argentina's few Geographic Indication (GI) Appellation and the best place to farm iconic wines. Altocedro is synonymous with outstanding La Consulta wines. Original old vine rootstocks, indigenous yeasts, hundred-year-old concrete fermentation tanks, and Karim's minimalist winemaking, create true terroir-driven wines.

The name Altocedro means high Cedar and the trees that surround the vineyards not only protect the vines from storms in the nearby Andes mountains, they also pays homage to Karim's roots because Cedar trees are considered sacred in the Lebanese culture.

Altocedro Cabernet Sauvignon Año Cero

La Consulta produces a cooler-climate Cab than most of Mendoza. Herbal and spice notes combine with creamy dark fruit flavors.

OPEN THE DOOR TO DISCOVERY



Lamadrid founder Guillermo García Lamadrid opened the door from his home in Cuba when he was a child. With the turbulence in Cuba at the time of the Revolution, his mother Matilde put him on an airplane to embark on a new life. Many more doors opened during his lifetime, all leading to Argentina and the building of the Lamadrid winery in one of the oldest and most premier growing regions in Argentina: **Agrelo**, "the land of Malbec," Mendoza. Lamadrid's mission is to be the best representation of its Agrelo terroir.

Following their philosophy that "Wine Is Made In The Vineyard, Let The Terroir Speak For Itself," Lamadrid owns three vineyards in Agrelo: Finca La Matilde (planted 1929), Finca Lamadrid (1973), and Finca La Suiza (2004). With winemaker **Angie Yañez** at the helm, their wines are all estate grown from one of these single vineyards, and follow organic and sustainable farming practices. The vineyards are irrigated with the pure water from the Andes and the wines are vinified using only indigenous yeasts with no fining or filtration.

Gabriela García is the global brand ambassador and Leonardo Garbi director of sales. In addition to Malbecs, Lamadrid is renowned as a leading producer of high-quality Cabernet Franc, Cabernet Sauvignon, and Bonarda.

As Robert Parker said, Lamadrid is "A great value winery to look for."

Food, Wine, Bocce: Ancient traditions brought from distant lands and new roots in the New World. Our winery in Lujan de Cuyo is home to a bit of this history: the neighborhood court, where residents spent hours laughing, drinking wine, and playing bocce.





Located in San Javier, Rio Negro, Patagonia, Argentina, Wapisa is just 25 miles from the Atlantic ocean and is the only winery that exists in this unique coastal terroir. Our vineyard terroir is complemented by the cool maritime breezes that sweep over the vineyards at night, leading to balanced and fruity wines with a touch of salinity and a delicate varietal expression. Anko means "high water" in the native Indian language of Salta, located in the northwest corner of Argentina. Wine Enthusiast quoted Anko winemaker Jeff Mausbach as follows: "Salta is a land of extremes—extreme beauty, extreme altitude, extreme sunlight. These extremes make for a singular expression of Malbec—powerful, structured wines with a savory minerality that is very different from other regions in Argentina."

In this rugged, mountainous desert, an "Anko," or high altitude oasis, was treasured as a precious sanctuary, protection from the harsh elements of nature.

Our estate vineyards in Estancia Los Cardones, named for the area's majestic cacti, which can grow as tall as 30 feet, are indeed an oasis amid the surrounding jagged landscape. The head winemaker is Diana "La Tana" Bellincioni; the co-winemakers and co-owners are Jeff Mausbach and Alejandro "Colo" Sejanovich; the other co-owners are the Saavedra Azcona family.

Anko Cabernet Sauvignon Flor de Cardon

Sourced from the Tolombon district of Salta, the northernmost winemaking province of Argentina. Located just south of the town of Cafayate, Estancia Los Cardones is located at 5,700' elevation, high on the eastern slope of the Valle de Calchaquies.

Tigerstone

The soil profile of Estancia Los Cardones is unique in the Calchaquí Valleys as it is a very shallow rocky soil with abundant chipped slate stone on the surface, full of disintegrated mica.

The climate is dry throughout the year, except for some occasional rains during the summer season. Warm days and cold nights with thermal amplitudes greater than 25 degrees. The orientation of the vineyards, the intense sun and the stony soil favor the earliest maturity of the grape, being the first estate to be harvested in the entire Calchaquí Valley.

Tigerstone Garnacha

The bluish slabs of soils that cover the upper part of our Tolombón vineyard was what prompted us to plant this variety in the most stony area of our vineyard. A small production that brings the Garnacha from Argentina to your glass.

Kura Selections is Vino del Sol's portfolio of artisanal sakes. Kura Selections launched Obata Shuzo and its Manotsuru product line, in 2008.

Obata Shuzo has been hand-making boutique premium sake since its founding in 1892, using pure, soft groundwater and world-famous Sado Island, Niigata sake rice. The kura is still owned and managed by the Obata family; fifth generation Rumiko Obata runs the brewery and is a leading woman of sake. The toji (master brewer) is the acclaimed Kenya Kudo. The brewery has received Gold Medals at National New Sake Competition, at the International Wine Challenge, the Fine Sake Awards Japan Competition, and the U.S. National Sake Appraisal, as well as 90 point scores and Best Buys from Beverage Testing Institute. The brewery has been featured in Wine & Spirits, the Los Angeles Times, Wine Enthusiast, and Wine Spectator.

Rumiko and Obata Shuzo are also leaders in sustainability and were the 2020 winner of the Sataoyoma Award for Sustainability.

River Farm is fortunate to have family owned vineyards in both the Wairau and Awatere Valleys. Although both valleys are located in Marlborough, they each have differences in soil and climate forming their own unique characteristic fruit flavors.

An elegant wine with a finely concentrated palate displaying aromatic white and yellow stonefruits lifted by exotic florals, rose-petal elements and complex nutty and flinty nuances. The wine shows excellent fruit intensity and silky texture, leading to a lingering smooth finish.

WINE AS A WORK OF ART. FROM THE EARTH TO THE GLASS



Bodegas Ontañón is a family-owned winery located in the heart of Rioja. For four generations, the Pérez Cuevas family has cultivated vineyard land south of the Ebro River just outside the tiny town of Quel. Through the years they have continued to purchase property near their original holdings on the higher-elevation slopes (2,600 feet above sea level) of the Sierra Yerga Mountains and currently have more than 800 hectares planted to vine, making them one of the top three family vineyard owners in Spain.

Raquel (President), Ruben (winemaker), and Leticia (vineyard manager) Pérez Cuevas make up the current generation of the Pérez Cuevas family to carry on a tradition of winemaking in the eastern part of La Rioja, Rioja Oriental. Their father, Gabriel, took over in the 1970s and began making wine from the vineyards rather than selling fruit. Ontañón is the name of the mountain valley where the majority of the family's vineyard land lies. The wines have been recognized with high accolades by press and critics across the world.



RESPECT TO WINE, CULTURE & SOIL



The Wines of Dominio de Queirón were conceived by the Pérez Cuevas family in their native Quel, which is located in the heart of the Cidacos river valley in the sub-region of Rioja Oriental. The winery strives to produce the absolute best wines possible from their native region. The vineyards are located between the Sierra Yerga and La Hez mountain ranges in the heart of the Barrio de Bodegas de Quel; an emblematic enclave of the 18th century that represents the historical roots of this tiny village in Rioja, with respect to wine, culture and soil. This includes the famed La Pasada vineyard, located at 2600 feet above sea level, some of the highest vineyard land planted in Rioja.

Queirón embodies the philosophy of the Pérez Cuevas family, who has been focused on the world of wine for four generations. Queirón is the culmination of the dream of third generation patriarch Gabriel Pérez, winemaker and pioneering wine entrepreneur in this area of Rioja Oriental. The project has restored historical areas and vineyards in the surrounding areas of Quel alongside the slopes that define the Sierra de Yerga mountain range. The Queirón winery is one of the most technologically-advanced wineries in Rioja. The terroir bridges a relationship between viticulture and the period of the Middle Ages, as evidenced by the ancient castle of Quel, that overlooks the winery.

Queirón Mi Lugar Tempranillo & Garnacha

Ripe, dark fruit such as blueberries, blackcurrants, blackberries, redcurrant, plums, cherries and figs all appear only to be replaced by a multitude of spicy notes such as incense, coffee and truffle.

These two historic Castilian appellations are located on the banks of the Duero river, which is the largest in the Peninsula and the home of one of the world's greatest winemaking traditions in Spain. Rueda and Ribera del Duero are two appellations with deep-rooted prestige and historical tradition in Spain. 100% estate fruit from sustainably-farmed vineyards.
